THIS CONTRACT is made and entered into by and between Youth Services, hereinafter referred to as "YS" and Orleans Parish Juvenile Court, hereinafter referred to as "Contractor".

This contract contains or has attached hereto all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the contracting parties. In consideration of the mutual promises contained herein, the parties hereto agree and bind themselves and their successors as follows:

SECTION I. SCOPE OF SERVICES:

The approximate number of treatment slots/units of service is 100.

Purpose: Provide diversion services to 100 youth and their families in Region I.

Specific referral/admission criteria: Youth between the ages of 10-17 who are arrested and released awaiting adjudication. Upon arrest, youth who score 13-14 on the Risk Assessment Instrument (RAI) are automatically referred to the Program. Upon review, a Judge may refer a pre-adjudicated case when it is determined that a youth may be at risk of out of home placement may benefit from ODAP services.

Specific exclusions from referral/admission: Youth not complying with the program can be removed from the program by the Supervising Judge for which the youth has an open case.

Specific goals, objectives and deliverables: Provide Diversion Program that prevents "at-risk" youth from becoming involved in criminal or other antisocial activities while taking youth who would ordinarily be processed in the Juvenile Justice system, and placing them in an alternative program. This program will also prevent youth from undergoing formal court proceedings.
