With LETA funds we were able to purchase a majority of the items outlined in our acceptance letter including the ham radio, PA and power supply modules, UPS, 2-way radios, portable recorders and printers. The cost of these items came in lower than expected, so we were also able to purchase a Shure microphone for field recordings.

We were unable to purchase the Globalcom satellite phone as outlined in our acceptance letter because we discovered that a significant number of satellites in the network are out of service, rendering the unit useless during emergency situations. The company plans to repair these satellites over the next year which is when we will revisit purchasing a satellite phone.

We used the funds allocated for the satellite phone to purchase a replacement computer for our digital audio workstation in our news department. The prior unit had become unreliable over the past few years and was nearing obsolescence. The funds also enabled us to purchase five external hard drives which will be used to backup all computer-based data at the station. An audio snake cable was also purchased to route audio between studios efficiently.

KSLU would like to thank LETA for providing us with much needed funding to continue our mission of training the students at Southeastern Louisiana University and providing outstanding public radio programming to our surrounding community. Your generosity is greatly appreciated.
